
## Supervised Independent Living program



Since 2014, Central Texas Table of Grace has operated a temporary shelter for displaced foster children between the ages of 6-17. We have seen first-hand the heartbreaking outcome for many of these kids when they turn 18. Statistics show much higher instances of early pregnancy, homelessness, addiction, incarceration and unemployment are for kids who age out of foster care.

- Each year, more than 23,000 children age out of the system, with 20% of them becoming instantly homeless
- Less than 2% go to college (despite Texas foster kids receiving free college) and many age out without a high school diploma
- Only half of foster kids who age out of the system will have gainful employment by the age of 24
- It is VERY rare that a foster kid ages out with a car in their possession, or a driver's license for that matter

This is the inspiration for our *Grace365 Supervised Independent Living program* for kids 18-21 who have aged out of foster care. Phase 1, which is already in-progress, involves leasing an apartment and connecting the youth with a home, existing services, mentoring and guidance. Phase 2, is the long-term goal, which is also already in-progress, and involved newly acquired land in Round Rock. We converted the existing building into a community center where we will provide meals a few times a week, life skills classes, host volunteers, employee / volunteer training, host events for foster youth, and storage. Our plan is to continue to grow the property with apartments for foster youth, a new shelter for the foster kids, and more. We are already forging partnerships for this long-term vision. As we work on this sustainable vision, we continue to help young adults aging out of foster care have productive, healthy, and happy lives.
